




GROWING YOUR OWN TOMATOES IS

FOR A WIDER CHOICE OF VARIETY AND TYPE, HAVE A LOOK AT OUR SEED RANGE



Traditionally tomatoes are grown on a single main stem.

This is achieved by using a cane stick, or length of string dangling from something to tie the main stem to.

UNRULY PLANTS TO KEEP

OUT THE SIDE BRANCHES






Some self-control is required here, and avoid picking off the flowery bits that will bear your tomatoes!
